Lindsay Held is the President and co-founder of Litigation Settlement Administration Corp. (“LSAC”), a specialty legal administrative services company focused on the mass torts industry. Mr. Held is a Columbia Law School trained attorney and a graduate of The Wharton School, where he received his M.B.A. in finance and entrepreneurial management.

As a corporate transactional attorney who has transitioned into strategic operating roles, Mr. Held’s vision for Litigation Settlement Administration Corp is in many respects the culmination of his multi-disciplinary background and experience. Prior to founding LSAC, Mr. Held was CEO of a financial services company formed by former Cantor Fitzgerald executive. The main focus being on brokerage activities for hedge funds and other institutional investors in the secondary life insurance market.

During his tenure at Cantor Fitzgerald, Mr. Held was general counsel and head of business affairs for the LifeMarkets division, which created the first electronic marketplace for institutional investors seeking to trade life insurance policies. Prior to joining Cantor Fitzgerald, he successfully co-founded several entrepreneurial ventures, including the Kabillion network, video-on-demand (VOD) channel operating on Comcast, and launched several retail businesses.

Mr. Held has a wide-range of experience handling mergers and acquisitions, securities offerings, general corporate matters on behalf of both private and publicly traded companies, intellectual property matters, including sports endorsement and affiliation agreements and transactions in the music and entertainment industries. In addition, he has varied experience in prosecuting consumer class action cases on behalf of plaintiff classes.

Subsequent to receiving his M.B.A. from Wharton, Mr. Held was a member of the Investment Banking Group at Deutsche Bank Securities, where he focused on the telecom and media industries.
